## **NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

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Notice is hereby given that the annual general meeting of Bailador Technology Investments Limited (**Company**) will be held online as a virtual meeting accessible at <https://agmlive.link/BTI20> at 11:00am (AEDT) on Tuesday 27 October 2020 (**Meeting**).

The Company is pleased to provide Shareholders with the opportunity to participate in the Meeting electronically through an online platform. Further information on how to participate in the meeting electronically is set out in the Notes section of this notice of annual general meeting (**Notice**) and the User Guide appended to this Notice and which will also be available at the Company's website.

Due to current circumstances relating to COVID-19 and associated government-imposed restrictions and recommendations on physical gatherings, there will be no physical meeting where Shareholders and proxies can attend in person.

This Notice is an important document and should be read in its entirety. The explanatory memorandum attached to this Notice (**Explanatory Memorandum**) provides additional information on matters to be considered at the Meeting. The Explanatory Memorandum and the proxy form are part of this Notice.

### Questions

In accordance with the Corporations Act and the Company's policy, reasonable opportunity will be provided to members during the Meeting to:

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### How to vote

#### Voting Entitlement

Individual members who are registered shareholders of the Company as at 7:00pm (AEDT) on 25 October 2020 will be entitled to vote in person or by proxy. Body corporates may vote by appointing a corporate representative. Each registered shareholder has one vote on a show of hands or one vote for each fully paid share on a poll.

#### Proxies

A member entitled to attend and vote is entitled to appoint a proxy to attend and vote in their stead. That person need not be a member of the Company, and can be a natural person over the age of 18 years or a body corporate. Completed and signed forms must be lodged at the registered office of the Company by no later than 11:00am (AEDT) on 25 October 2020 in the manner specified below in this notice.

A member entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies. If a member appoints two proxies, the member may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If no proportion or number of votes is specified, each proxy may exercise half the member's votes.

Subject to the specific proxy provisions applying to Item 2 (Adoption of Remuneration Report) as noted in the Explanatory Memorandum below:

- if a shareholder has not directed their proxy how to vote, the proxy may vote as the proxy determines; and
- if a shareholder appoints the chair of the Meeting as proxy and does not direct the chair how to vote on an item of business, the chair will vote in accordance with his voting intention as stated in this Notice, namely in favour of each of the proposed resolutions set out in this Notice.



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### **How to appoint a proxy**

Proxies participating in the virtual Meeting will receive an email from the Company's share registry Link Market Services prior to the Meeting containing details of their proxy number which they will need to use for the online registration process. Proxies are asked to log in online 15 minutes prior to the time designated for the commencement of the Meeting, if possible, to register and obtain a voting card.

### **Virtual Participation**

Consistent with the temporary modifications to the *Corporations Act 2001 (Cth)* introduced by the *Corporations (Coronavirus Economic Response) Determination (No. 1) 2020*, the Board has determined to conduct the Meeting as a virtual meeting and that Shareholders will have the opportunity to participate in the Meeting by electronic means through an online platform. There will be no physical meeting where shareholders or proxies can attend in person.

Shareholders who wish to participate in the Meeting online may do so from their computer by logging into the online platform at <https://agmlive.link/BTI20>. Instructions on how to log into the portal are provided in the User Guide appended to this Notice.

If you choose to participate in the Meeting, you will be able to view the Meeting live, lodge a direct vote in real time and ask questions online.

Shareholders participating in the Meeting using the online platform will be able to cast direct votes and ask questions 30 minutes prior to commencement of the Meeting (11:00am AEDT on Tuesday 27 October 2020) and the closure of voting as announced by the Chairman during the Meeting.

More information regarding online participation in the Meeting (including how to vote and ask questions online during the Meeting) is available in the User Guide. The User Guide is attached to this Notice of Meeting and will be lodged with the ASX and will be available on our website.



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**Joint holders**

If more than one joint holder of shares is present at the Meeting (whether personally, by proxy or by attorney or corporate representative) and tenders a vote, only the vote of the joint holder whose name appears first on the register will be counted.

**Corporate representatives**

A body corporate which is a shareholder, or which has been appointed as a proxy, is entitled to appoint any person to act as its representative at the Meeting. The appointment of the representative must comply with the requirements of section 250D of the Corporations Act. The representative must bring to the Meeting a properly executed "*Certificate of Appointment of Corporate Representative*" or other document confirming its authority to act as the company's representative. 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## **EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM**

This Explanatory Memorandum forms part of the Notice convening the Meeting. Information relevant to the business to be conducted at the Meeting is provided in this Explanatory Memorandum and the document should be read in full.

### **ORDINARY BUSINESS**

#### **Item 1: Financial statements and reports**

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the financial report, the directors' and auditor's report for the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2020 will be put before the Meeting.

Members will have a reasonable opportunity at the Meeting to ask questions or make comments on these reports and on the business, operations and management of the Company.

There is no requirement for a formal resolution on this item.

The Company's auditor, Hall Chadwick, will be present and will be provided with a reasonable opportunity to answer written questions that have been submitted to the Company no later than Tuesday 20 October 2020 (being the fifth business day before the Meeting) in accordance with section 250PA(1) of the Corporations Act.

#### **Item 2: Remuneration Report**

##### **Resolution 1 – Adoption of Remuneration Report**

The Company's Remuneration Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2020, which is set out in pages 25-27 of the annual report, has been submitted to members for consideration and adoption.

The Remuneration Report details the remuneration policy for the Company and reports the remuneration arrangements for its 'key management personnel' (as defined in section 9 of the Corporations Act) (**KMP**) including directors. A reasonable opportunity will be provided for members to ask questions about, or make comments on, the Remuneration Report.

In accordance with section 250R(3) of the Corporations Act, the resolution on this item of business is advisory only and does not bind the board or the Company.

As a result of the Corporations Act provisions generally known as the 'two strikes rule', members should note that the result of the vote on this item may affect the conduct of next year's annual general meeting.

If 25% or more of votes that are cast are voted against the adoption of the Remuneration Report at two consecutive annual general meetings (constituting 'two strikes'), members will be required to vote at the second of those annual general meetings on a resolution (a 'spill resolution') determining whether to hold a further meeting within 90 days to spill the board as required by section 250V(1) of the Corporations Act (a 'spill meeting'). If the spill resolution is approved, all of the directors (other than the managing director) must stand for re-election at the spill meeting.



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Directors' Recommendation

The board recommends members vote in favour of Resolution 1.

Voting Exclusion Statement

As required by the Corporations Act, the Company will disregard any votes cast on Resolution 1 (in any capacity) by or on behalf of any member of its KMP or a 'closely related party' of any such member (as defined in section 9 of the Corporations Act).

However, the Company need not disregard the vote if:

- (a) it is cast by a person referred to above (who is otherwise excluded from voting on Resolution 1) as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with the directions on the proxy form; or
- (b) it is cast by the person chairing the meeting (**Chair**) as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with a direction on the proxy form to vote as the proxy decides.

If you intend to appoint a member of the KMP (such as one of the directors) as your proxy, please ensure that you direct them how to vote on Resolution 1. If you intend to appoint the Chair as your proxy, you can direct them how to vote on Resolution 1 or you can choose not to mark any of the boxes for Resolution 1 and give the Chair your express authority to vote your undirected proxy (in which case the Chair will vote in favour of this item of business). The Chair intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 1.

**Item 3: Ratification of Shares**

**Resolution 2 – Ratification of Prior Issue of Shares Issued in March 2020**

Background

On 13 February 2020 BTI announced its first special dividend of 2.5 cents per share fully franked and opened the Company's Dividend Reinvestment Plan (DRP). The Company also announced on that date, that the Company's DRP was being supported by a number of institutional investors by way of a shortfall placement. On 26 March the Company issued 1,571,503 shortfall placement shares (Shares) under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 pursuant to the Company's 15% capacity at a price of \$1.0552 per share.

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 provides that a company must not, subject to specified exceptions, issue or agree to issue more equity securities during any 12 month period than that amount which represents 15% of the number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue at the commencement of that 12 month period.

ASX Listing Rule 7.4 allows the Company's shareholders in a general meeting to approve and ratify a previous issue of securities made or agreed to be made pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1. If shareholders approve the issue in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.4 (and provided that the previous issue did not breach Listing Rule 7.1) those securities issued in the previous issue will be treated as having been made with shareholder approval for the purpose of ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and so does not reduce the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without shareholder approval under that rule.



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The issue of the Shares does not fit within any of the sated exceptions to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and, as it occurred without the approval of the Shareholders, it uses up part of the 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 for the 12 month period following the issue date.

With Resolution 2, the Company is seeking Shareholder approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 to ratify the prior issue and allotment of the Shares issued under the Company's ASX Listing Rule 7.1 capacity to restore the Company's capacity to issue up to 15% of its ordinary issued capital under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 without seeking further Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 2 is passed, the issue of the Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's 15% limit in ASX Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the issue date of the Shares.

If Resolution 2 is not passed, the Shares will be included in calculating the Company's 15% limit in ASX Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the issue date of the Shares.

#### Technical Information Required by ASX Listing Rule 7.4

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to the Ratification:

- 1,571,503 DRP shortfall placement shares (Shares) were issued pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1
- The Shares were issued at an issue prices of \$1.0552 to raise \$1,658,250 (before costs);
- The Shares issued were all fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company issued on the same terms and conditions as the Company's existing shares;
- The Shares were issued to various institutional investors, note of whom are related parties of the Company (refer to the Company's announcements on 13 February and 26 March 2020);
- The funds raised from this issue have been, or will be, used to fund the on-going working capital and investment operations of the Company.

#### Directors' Recommendation

The Board unanimously recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

#### Voting Exclusion Statement

In accordance with ASX Listing Rule 14.11 the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour on Resolution 2 by or on behalf of any person who participated in the shortfall placement or any of their associates.

However, the Company need not disregard a vote cast on Resolution 2 if:

- it is cast by a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the resolution, in accordance with the directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the resolution in that way; or
- It is cast by the chair of the meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the chair to vote on the resolution as the chair decides; or



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- It is cast by a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
  - The beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on Resolution 2; and
  - The holder votes on Resolution 2 in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

If you intend to appoint a member who participated in the shortfall placement shares as your proxy, please ensure that you direct them how to vote on Resolution 2.

The Chair (who did not participate in the shortfall placement) intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 2.

#### **Item 4: Election of directors**

Clause 19.3 of the Company's constitution and ASX Listing Rule 14.5 requires an election of directors to take place each year. The directors to retire under clause 19.3 of the Company's constitution are those who have been in office the longest since being appointed (and if more than one, those directors by agreement or ballot between themselves).

The Board has determined that David Kirk will retire from office under clause 19.3 of the constitution and stand for re-election.

#### **Resolution 3 – Re-election of David Kirk as director**

Resolution 3 relates to the re-election of David Kirk as a director of the Company. Mr Kirk was appointed to the Company's board on 4 August 2014.

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##### ***David Kirk***

**Executive Director**

- *David has been Chief Executive of two ASX-listed companies, including diversified media company, Fairfax Media Limited, where he led a number of successful internet sector investments. David is currently Chairman of ASX-listed company Kathmandu Holdings Limited and is Chairman of Forsyth Barr Limited, a privately owned investment firm and the Sydney Festival. David holds several BTI portfolio directorships as Chairman of Rezdy and SMI and a director each of Instaclustr, DocsCorp and Viostream.*
  - *David is a Rhodes Scholar with degrees in Medicine from Otago University and Philosophy, Politics and Economics from Oxford University. David enjoyed a highly successful rugby career, captaining the All Blacks to win the World Cup in 1987. He was awarded an MBE in 1987.*



## Partial Votes
